2 The state income tax is Ohio's biggest source of money to pay for these vital public services.



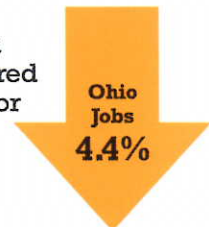
3 Income tax cuts benefit the wealthiest Ohioans most. Since the 21% cuts in 2005, here's who saved what:

Income Category	Average Annual Cut
Top 1% (>\$308,000)	\$9,556
Next 4% (\$135,000 to \$308,000)	\$1,688
Next 15% (\$75,000 to \$135,000)	\$692
Fourth 20% (\$49,000 to \$75,000)	\$325
Middle 20% (\$32,000 to \$49,000)	\$181
Second 20% (\$18,000 to \$32,000)	\$72
Lowest 20% (<\$18,000)	\$19

4 And when we tried this before, it didn't work!

Since the 2005 tax cuts, Ohio has lost more than 4.4% of its jobs, compared to less than half of 1% for the United States.
